Instructor Score and Written Assignment Score – 50 points possible: There will be 4 written review assignments worth 5 points each for a total of 20 points possible. These written review assignments are found at the Written Assignments link of the main MA 109 web page and will be due on the Tuesday before the day of the exam. Note there are also review assignments at the MA 109 web site but you will only be required to complete and turn in the Written Assignments. The written assignments are old MA 109 exams and will be a good review for each exam. The instructor score, worth 30 points, will be determined by the short quizzes that will be given at almost every class meeting and your attendance. You will receive 5 points for the completion of the quiz and 5 points for the correctness of your work. I will give partial credit. I will take attendance at each class meeting and this will count as part of the 30 points. No make up quizzes will be given without a valid excuse. Your quiz and attendance average x 30 will determine the number of points that you will receive for your instructor score. The formula I will use to compute this is:

$(\text{Attendance} + \text{Quiz Points Earned}) / (\text{Attendance} + \text{Quiz Points Possible} - 5) * 30$.

The maximum number of points possible from your written assignments and Instructor Score is 50 points.
