Homework: Written Homework is assigned weekly and will be due at the beginning of class each Wednesday. As a general rule, no late homework will be accepted.

Students are encouraged to form study groups and discuss homework and the course material with each other. However, the homework you submit to be graded should be your own work. If you work with someone on a particular problem(s), clearly indicate this in your write-up.

The homework will be graded on completeness (15 points) and the three starred problems for accuracy (5 points). The maximum you can receive on any homework assignment is 30 points.

Quizzes: There will be a weekly quiz, at the end of class on Fridays, starting Jan. 18. There will be no quiz the week of an exam. The lowest quiz score will be dropped at the end of the semester.

Exams: There will be two in-class exams during the semester. It is possible that some of these might be taken-home exams or have taken-home components. Exam 1 is scheduled for Friday, February 15. Exam 2 is scheduled for Friday, April 5.

Final Exam: Tuesday, April 30, 2019, 10:30am-12:30am, in our regular classroom, though part or all of the final exam might be take-home. The final exam is cumulative.
